Our Child Care Center started a new school year in August, welcoming students from families living at St. Ann's as well as families in our local community. Furthermore, this year St. Ann's began our first *Head Start* classroom, expanding upon our *Early Head Start* program incorporated in 2017.

This expansion is an amazing blessing for St. Ann's and the families we serve.

In September, we welcomed two new resident families – one to our *Teen Mother & Baby Program*, and one to *Hope House*, our supportive housing program for mothers and their children.

Also in September, our Board of Directors approved St. Ann's new three-year Strategic Plan, ensuring a bright and hopeful future for our programs. We are so thankful for the start of this new chapter in St. Ann's amazing163-year history.

... So, I searched online for single-mother housing programs, found St. Ann's, and we moved in on March 22, 2022.

When I first arrived to St. Ann's, I was nervous. I transferred here from Northern Virginia, so I did not know Maryland or many people here. St. Ann's is also a quiet place, not like the shelters I had been to. It took time, but I got used to St. Ann's and I always asked questions when I needed help. Ms. Keisha has been especially helpful to me.

The whole St. Ann's staff is very nice. My only challenge here has been saying goodbye when staff members leave St. Ann's! It is hard when you have gotten close to that person.

Today I am on track to achieve my goals and dreams. I work at a Walgreen's customer service center while my son attends St. Ann's Child Care. My plan is to become a nurse or nursing assistant by the end of 2025, since I enjoy the healthcare field and helping people that way. It is a challenge to balance online classes with my work schedule and parenting, but I am trying my best and I will get there.

My dreams are not about material things – they are about a successful life. Same thing for my child; I want him to have the best life possible, and to have the experiences I did not have.



"What I've learned about motherhood is to be positive, even through difficult times. Motherhood is challenging – but at the same time I am happy, because I'm here at St. Ann's. I've learned that taking things step-by-step is the best way to reach my goals and create a better life for me and my child."

The advice I would give to new mothers in my position would be to take life slow. There are many distractions, but try to step back and think about the future. The past can affect you, but move forward and don't look back – the past will not return.

"It is hard to give advice, since everyone is different. You cannot be me, and I cannot be you. Just do your thing – and believe in God that life will get better. Have faith! Tomorrow is another day."

I am making each day count. I spend quality time with my son every night after I am done with work. I also try to read in my free time to help catch up on my education. It was hard for me when I first came to this country. I couldn't say one word in English. In high school I could not respond when someone said, "How are you?" That made it hard to make friends.

But I became close with my teachers and would eat lunch with them and even have afterschool tutoring with them to help me improve. Sometimes I wish I was still in high school because of those positive memories. I thank God now that my conversational English has improved to the level I am at today. My next goal is to work on my reading and writing skills.

The last 6-7 years have been challenging, moving between different shelters and roommates. But I lived, you know? I say thank you to God, to be alive today. That's all I can say.

My message for anyone going through a challenging time is: Take it slow. You will learn everything you need to know in time. Believe in yourself and try not to compare yourself to others.


Young Professionals Network Hosts Summer Happy Hour






St. Ann's Center Clients Achieve Amazing Things in FY23

SIX families (6 mothers and 8 children) lived at *Faith House* in FY2023, as they prepared to transition to independent, stable housing.
