In Her Own Words: Amber's Story



Dr. Amber Andrews (pictured here with her daughter) shared her story at Hope Blossoms on May 8, 2024.

My name is Dr. Amber Andrews. I am honored and happy to speak to you all. I want to start by thanking St. Ann's staff and guests for having me as your guest speaker. This is the first time I'm sharing my story in front of a large audience. And I will be as open and vulnerable as possible.

Let me tell you how I became a resident of St. Ann's in 1999. I was 18 and my relationship with my son's father moved very quickly. We moved in together, got engaged, and I become pregnant. Unfortunately, my son's father tragically passed away, when I was still early in my pregnancy. My parents told me that I could not come and live with them, nor did I have any other family or friends that I could live with...

Amber's Story, Continued

My mother's co-worker told her about the amazing program at St. Ann's. I finally had a glimmer of hope. My mother and I had the opportunity to take a tour before I became a resident. I was amazed at all St. Ann's had to offer.

While I was a resident; I was really struggling with the recent loss of my child's father, having to adjust to a new environment, experiencing pregnancy for the first time, and I was the oldest young woman on the Infant and Maternity Unit.

However, I quickly adjusted. I loved the fact that I had so much support at St. Ann's. The other moms and I received transportation to and from our doctors' appointments, all our meals were provided, in house daycare for the children, in house school for the teen moms, formula, diapers, toys, clothes, and activities.

I knew that I had to keep pushing forward. Not only did I have to support myself, but I also had to support the new life growing inside me. Because of God, my resilience, and the support of St. Ann's I was able to go back to college and graduate.

After I delivered my son; the staff was so helpful. I remember one night I was battling postpartum depression and crying. I was trying to feed my newborn baby who would not breast-feed. One of the staff members came in and gave me a break to calm myself down.

On the Infant and Maternity Unit, I made connections with the other teen moms, who had experienced many hardships. I remember there was a young mom that was only fourteen in the program with me. As the oldest mom there, I encouraged the younger moms to keep focusing on their goals and strive to be the best mom they can be.


Part Two of my St. Ann's residency was at
Faith House – my first experience of independent living
with my son. Faith House taught me the responsibility
of maintaining my own apartment. I loved having my
son's daycare right across the street. Because St. Ann's
provided childcare, I was able to start my career.

The friendships I made at Faith House were amazing. We watched each other's children, we encouraged each other, we cooked together, and did activities with our children. Staff and/or the sisters would provide transportation when we needed to go to the

grocery store, mall, and/or doctor's appointments. If we needed a listening ear or advice, one of the staff and/or sisters would be there to help.

After transitioning from Faith House, I was able to continue to accelerate in my career. I got married to my amazing supportive husband, Jermaine, who has allowed me the opportunity to explore any hobby or career field I am interested in pursuing.

My son Mikhail who also lived with me at Faith House is now 24 years old and doing amazing. I also have a beautiful daughter, Alani who is 17 years old, in the Drama Club, and on honor roll in high school. I just want to take this moment to thank my family for their continued support.



I also want to say to everyone in the room...

Don't ever give up! A few years ago, I said to myself,
"I am meant for more than this." I also heard a
speech... the speaker said: "Your success is tied into
someone else's success." I knew then I must be
great to help others be great. I decided to go back
to school.

Side note: I said I would never go back to school after I graduated college. And yet going back helped me change my life and others.' I received my Real Estate License, my Financial Education License, and an Honorary Doctoral Degree in Business Development. Honestly, I never thought I would have accomplished any of this. **Thank you, God!!!**
